There were 289 deaths reported to the coroner. Of those reported, 123 cases were eventually referred to an attending physician because they did not meet the definition of a coroner case. Of those 123 death referrals, (12) required on-the-scene investigation before a determination could be rendered. One Hundred Sixty-Six (166) cases became coroner cases as defined by the Ohio Revised Code.
